# What Can We Learn from the List of Services Below?

- There is a lot more money in Medicaid than there is in State-funded services.
- Medicaid recipients are entitled to receive the benefits and State-funded recipients are not entitled so benefits are based on availability of funding.
- Tailored Plan recipients (pending legislative authority) will have access to a wider array of BH/I-DD services than Standard recipients.
- State-funded services include multiple support services.
- State-funded services are used to support Medicaid beneficiaries with I-DD needs while they wait to receive an Innovations waiver slot.
