

WHY YOU SHOULD ATTEND

North Carolina is working toward a shift in the Medicaid managed care program with the implementation of the BH/IDD Tailored Plans on October 1, 2023. This is the next step in transitioning North Carolina's Medicaid program to a system of managed, integrated whole person care. The BH/IDD Tailored Plan integrates behavioral health and substance use disorder, intellectualdevelopmental disability, physical health, pharmacy, care management and brain injury services for those with severe and persistent mental illness, I/DD and SUD needs under one program managed by LME/MCOs. The Standard Plan's integrated care for the mild to moderate behavioral health population began in July 2021.

Our theme this year, Critical **Connections: People-Data-Care** stems from the truth that as we move further along with integrated care, connections will be critical to success. This shift requires a true focus on people, with an essential need for **data** sharing that facilitates care integration. This theme will be woven throughout the sessions which will be led by national and state experts offering insightful information, updates and policy details designed to inform and guide leaders and stakeholder through these challenging times.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Anyone in the NC Medicaid system that is managing, experiencing or providing care to the BH/IDD population who wants to better understand the new structures, partnerships and program collaborations needed to move services toward an integrated whole person care approach.





Navigating A Turbulent Landscape: Building Resilience in Organizations Serving Consumers with Complex Needs

The health and human service market landscape is shifting. At a national level, virtual delivery systems, retail clinics (and Amazon), and an expanding health plan footprint are changing the expectations of consumers and payers. 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

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

Navigating the BH/IDD Tailored Plans

Medicaid members will still be adjusting to the transition to BH/IDD Tailored Plans for some time after the October 1 go-live. This panel of BH/IDD Tailored Plan leaders will talk about their processes to assist Medicaid members and providers with an emphasis on those times when individuals hit roadblocks that may impact their access to services. North Carolina's Medicaid Managed Care includes a multitude of components that will require coordination in order to achieve integrated whole person care. This means that Medicaid members and providers will have access to new and/or different supports such as care managers, non-emergency medical transportation, integrated consideration of BH/IDD and physical health care.


