



Paying the Way: Year 1 Milestones in Medicaid and Strengthening NC's MH/SUD/IDD/TBI System

The NCDHHS Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Use Services (DMHDDSUS) will highlight recent successes in key areas of their new \$835 million investment, including crisis, justice, IDD/ TBI systems, and workforce. This presentation will also demonstrate how these new initiatives fit into DMHDDSUS' strategic plan and the division's broader vision for a MH/SU/IDD/TBI system where all are supported to live healthier and happier lives. NC Medicaid Deputy Secretary Jay Ludlam will also present and provide an update on the imminent implementation of Tailored Plans which will bring integrated care into our service system. 

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

Disruptive Innovation in Behavioral Healthcare: Al is only the Start

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has become very prominent in society, general healthcare and behavioral healthcare recently. But AI is only one of several technological advances that are already impacting behavioral health or are poised to do so. Virtual and Augmented Reality devices which have been used in the treatment of various mental health problems like phobias are becoming generally available. m-health and e-health mobile devices provide tools for consumers to monitor a wide variety of health-related activities and access medical and behavioral health services at their convenience. Genomic interventions can test for responsivity to drugs avoiding costly and harmful "treatment failure" protocols. Pharmaceutical manufacturers are developing individualized treatments tailored to people's individual genome and biome. Psychedelic drugs are showing dramatic and persistent improvements in several intransigent behavioral health problems. Deep brain implants originally pioneered for neurodegenerative diseases like Parkinsons are helping people with Treatment Resistant Depression. Brain-computer interfaces once thought to be the realm of science fiction is now a reality with Elon Musk's Neuralink business. This session will discuss these and other technological disruptions that are or soon will be affecting the behavioral health industry.

- Review three problems that are being successfully treated with psychedelic drugs
- Discuss two behavioral health problems being treated using brain implants
